Dear Kellye,

In our previous correspondence I welcomed the leadership role that you and the University of Washington School of Law exercised in the Second Annual Arctic Encounter Symposium.

I am writing you again to request that the Washington School of Law exercise a comparable leadership role, working through the Association of American Law Schools, to expand the curricula of law schools to include the topics of centralized regulatory review, regulatory compliance and regulatory policy. I am not alone in thinking that such an expansion is timely in that the topic is also addressed in the Yale-ABA Notice & Comment [blog](#).

The essence of my recommendation is that the AALS should create a panel to evaluate the updating of law school curricula as described in Penn RegBlog's Innovations in Regulatory Law [series](#). In that you are the President of the AALS, coupled with your wide range of experience in related venues, I believe this is the ideal time to act on this matter.

I also believe you are the ideal person to address this matter because of the emphasis you placed at the Arctic Encounter Symposium on the interdisciplinary approach to solving problems. To this end, scholars from the University of Washington schools of economics, political science and public policy could make invaluable contributions along with their counterparts in other universities and they should be included in an AALS panel. My colleague, Bruce Levinson has, on a previous occasion, discussed the OIRA [Teaching Module](#) with Dean Archibald of the Evans School.

I would appreciate the opportunity to discuss the above with you in greater detail.
